DAILY SUMMARY FOR THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 2, 2023

On Thursday, the [House Public Transportation Committee](#) advanced [HB1324](#). This bill would allow law enforcement officers to pull over a driver who does not have their vehicle headlights on when it is raining, snowing, or any time the windshield wipers are being used.

The full House passed [HB1267](#) which requires home caregivers to have a specific number of hours in dementia training.

The House also passed [HB1127](#) which creates the Rural Emergency Hospital Act. This bill would provide a way for rural hospitals in the state to qualify for a new federal designation and be reimbursed at a higher rate for outpatient services.

In addition, the House passed [HB1198](#). This bill would require polls to be open for early voting on county holidays. Polls would continue to be closed for early voting on state holidays.

The House passed [HB1258](#) which would allow cities to issue a permit for the use of sky lanterns if the event is open to the public.
